Notes from Philanthropy

Hello Quilters! In May we received six finished quilts and one pillowcase. Thank you all so much for the support you give to Philanthropy each month!

June Philanthropy Donations





In June we also made donations to two agencies. When we reached out to each of the agencies that we normally support to check their current needs for quilts, totes, cosmetic bags and pillowcases, Piedmont Women's Center in Greer told us they would love another donation. We brought them an assortment of infant quilts and Tummy Time pads. They were just thrilled with our donation and told us that they were down to their last quilt and were not sure when they would have more. Perfect timing!

We also supported a new-to-us agency in June when we were made aware of a "call for quilts" for Victory Junction by Cindy Brothers. Victory Junction is a year-round camp facility for children with serious illnesses and chronic medical conditions. Founded by Kyle Petty and his family in honor of his son Adam, Victory Junction provides life-changing camping experiences that are fun and empowering in a medically-safe environment that is free of charge. Each week the camp, staffed by doctors, nurses, and trained volunteers, hosts a program designed for children with a specific illness or condition, such as cancer, cerebral palsy, diabetes, or spina bifida. Since opening in 2004,

Victory Junction has delivered more than 100,000 camp experiences and has served children from all 50 states, Washington D.C., and Puerto Rico, as well as four countries.

Cindy delivered 24 children's quilts to Beginnings Quilt Shop in Hendersonville for distribution to the camp. To learn more about this program, check out the following link: https://victoryjunction.org/

After speaking with our partner agencies on their needs, we learned that at the present time there were no requests for tote bags, cosmetic bags, and toiletries. We have decided that for the remainder of this year as a Guild we will focus on just making quilts and pillowcases for donation. We have several lovely totes and cosmetic bags in storage that we are holding on to until we find a suitable agency that can really use these beautiful items.

Thank you all for your support and understanding that Philanthropy carefully checks with our agencies before making a donation to be sure that it is needed and will be put to good use!
