Meeting Minutes - June 4, 2024

Nancy Jones called the business part of our meeting to order. With the Recording Secretary not in attendance, Nancy asked for a volunteer to take minutes of the July meeting. Ruth Bartholomew volunteered. Nancy asked if there were any additions or corrections to the June minutes as they were printed in the newsletter. Hazel Abend noted that Leslie Reid's phone number was printed incorrectly in the addendum with that correction, Ruth Bartholomew made a motion that the minutes be accepted as printed in the newsletter. Tami Grabowski seconded the motion and the members agreed by verbal vote. Leslie Reid, Vice President, gave an overview of the upcoming programs this year, August through December 2024. Paula Bryan of Hospitality thanked everyone for the food and the help to set the tables. She reminded us that she could

not be the hostess anymore and asked for a volunteer. **Sheryl Sane** volunteered to be the hostess for the upcoming year. **Jana Fetch of Membership** reminded us that it is time to pay the yearly dues, and we currently have 34 members who have joined or renewed. Notes from Philanthropy

Hello Quilters!

In July we received two finished quilts, two pillowcases, and 18 cosmetic bags. Thank you all so much for the support you give to Philanthropy each month!

July Philanthropy Donations





One of the questions we are frequently asked is "What size quilts does Philanthropy like to receive?", and the simple answer is "we like every size and we always find a home for every quilt we receive!"

Our favorite sizes and types of quilts would be the categories listed below. We give an infant and an adult lap quilt to each new mom at St. Clares Maternity home. We also donate to agencies that support children and young adults in crisis, and always have a need for kid's quilts, especially boy-themed and teen-appropriate designs. When you are making a quilt top for Philanthropy, if possible, it helps us if the width of the top is around 40" so we can use 44-45" backing. We rely on donated fabric for our backings and rarely have wide backing available, and are also limited on donations of larger lengths of fabric that could be cut and pieced for a backing. We rarely have a need for really large quilts, such as Queen or King size quilts, and we don't have backing and batting readily available for big quilts and also, they are difficult for us to store (and donate).

Philanthropy Quilt Sizes

Infants and Baby & Tummy Time quilts: 35-40" W X 35-42" L

Toddlers through Pre-school: 35-40" W X 45-48" L

Children's Quilts (ages 6 -Teen): 39-42" W X 48-54" L

Adult Comfort Lap Quilts: 42-54" W X 58-62" L

Adult Throw Quilts: 54-60" W X 64-74" L

Another question we are asked is, "Should I wash any quilts before I donate them, or after I add a Binding?" The answer generally is "No." The agencies we presently work with do not ask us to wash any quilts before donating them, assuming the quilt is new. The exception is if you have a pet that just adores Philanthropy quilts and likes to nap on them when you are not around, these quilts should be washed to remove any pet hairs before donating. Thank you!

Return of Artwork:

At the conclusion of the Exhibition, Artwork will be repacked in the original packing materials to be picked up from the Green Room between 10:00am and 2:00pm on January 6-8, and no later than 14 days following the close of exhibition.

If the Artist desires a proxy to pick up the Artwork on their behalf, then the Artist must provide the proxy name and contact information in writing to Chelsea Fraser at FPC Arts before the closing date of the Exhibition. In the case of purchased work, the Artist is still responsible for pick-up and delivery of work to purchaser.

If the Artwork is not picked up despite all reasonable efforts by the FPC Arts, and no alternate

address or instructions are provided by the Artist, then FPC Arts will place the Artwork in storage at the Artist's risk and expense.

If the Artist does not provide alternate instructions to FPC Arts within 90 days after the Artwork is placed in storage, then FPC Arts may retain or dispose of the Artwork in any manner at their sole discretion including sale of the Artwork, and all proceeds, if any, shall be retained by FPC Arts.

Be prepared to sign a loan return release at pick up of Artwork.


