Education Moment - January 2024

It's so nice when the top and bottom surface of your quilt both have great quality stitch quality! Stitches look best when top and bottom tension are balanced, and the stitches sink into the quilt batting. Care in selecting fabric for the quilt back will make this easier to achieve. Helpful fabrics are soft and flexible. Less desirable choices are stiff or crisp. White on white fabrics, where the ink appears to sit on the fabric surface, often fall into this group of fabrics. Heavily sized quilt backs can sometimes be softened by washing before quilting.


Quilt Show Registration News

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Instructions and Rules

- Submit a completed registration form AND a color picture for each entry no later than, March 15th, 2024 to: FPQG Quilt Show Registration
 - PO box 26482 Greenville. SC 29616
- 2. The Foothills Piecemakers Quilting Guild (FPQG) Quilt Show is open to members only.
- 3. There is NO registration fee for Foothills Piecemakers Quilting Guild members.
- 4. All submitted entries must have been completed since the last FPQG Quilt Show in 2022.
- 5. Members can submit only 1 entry per category.
- 6. Foothills Piecemakers Quilting Guild is not responsible for lost or undelivered entries.
- 7. Quilts entered may be pieced by one individual and quilted by another and still maintain individual status. Include all names on the entry form so all contributors are recognized.
- 8. The Quilt Show Committee reserves the right to reassign a quilt into a different category based on size and technique, or to combine or adjust categories after registration forms and photos are received.
- 9. All bed quilts and large wall quilts must be ready to hang with a 4" wide sleeve securely sewn on the back. For quilts more than 90" in length, the sleeve should be placed to prevent dragging the bottom edge of the quilt on the floor, which is typically 90" above the bottom of the quilt when it is hung or pinned up by the owner. Large quilts without sleeves or sleeves less than 4" may be **disqualified** from being displayed.
- 10. **Miniature entries must meet these rules:** A pieced miniature quilt is a scaled down version of a larger quilt or block. All elements of an applique miniature quilt should be reduced in size to a proportion that matches the size of the quilt. No side of a miniature quilt can be larger than 24" and no block size larger than 3".
- 11. All quilts must have a label with the member's name securely sewn or safety pinned to the back of the quilt or quilted project. This can be attached on the inside of clothing or other displayed items.
- 12. While precautions will be taken to protect your entry, neither FPQG, the Quilt Show Committee, nor St. Giles Presbyterian Church can be held liable for any loss or damage to your Quilt Show entry. If you have concerns about the security and safety of your entry, please check with your homeowner's insurance agent to make sure your personal entries are adequately insured.
- 13. All entries shall be delivered to <u>St.Giles Presbyterian Church</u> on Thursday, <u>April 4th between the hours</u> of 9:00 and 11:00am. No entries will be accepted after 11:00am. If you are unable to deliver your quilt(s) that day and cannot find someone else to deliver them for you, please contact Suzanne Brehm 865-705-8460 to make special delivery arrangements.
- 14. Quilts will be available for pick-up approximately 45 minutes after the close of the Quilt Show on April <u>6th.</u> You will be required to initial for each quilt at pick-up. If you are having someone else pick up your quilts, that person will initial for your quilts. FPQG will not be responsible for lost quilts or ribbons when someone other than the quilt owner is retrieving them.
- 15. Please sign your Registration Form. Only signed forms with a photo will be accepted.

Programs

Upcoming Programs:

February Program

With our quilt show just around the corner, Karen Kendo will be presenting her lecture on Taking the Fear Out of Judging. This will be a synopsis of the judging criteria used by certified judges at quilt shows. The aim is to take the fear out of having your quilts judged and to expand the quilter's knowledge base. Some quilts from my collection are included. **Members are encouraged to bring any of their quilts for a mock judging. It would be great to get a variety of quilts from pieced, to applique to art style.**

Karen Kendo has been drawn to quilts since she was a child sleeping under a quilt made by her grandmother. After spending her early career teaching Chemistry and Physics, and working as a School Administrator, she rediscovered quilting in 1995. After 10 years of quilting for family and friends, and winning numerous awards along the way, she started a quilting business in 2006 – Quilting with Karen

She has judged guild shows in South Carolina and beyond, including Carolina Pine Quilters in Aiken, York County Quilters in Rock Hill, the Asheville, NC quilt show, the Upcountry Quilt Guild, the Foothills Quilt Guild, the Coastal Carolina Fair, the Orangeburg County Fair and the Sumter County Fair. In 2015. Karen applied and was accepted into candidacy to become a nationally certified quilt judge. In September of 2022 Karen completed all of the requirements and was awarded national quilt judge certification by the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges.

Karen's philosophy of quilt judging is to select the entries that are outstanding in each category and to provide all entrants with positive feedback in areas where the quilter excels and to give constructive remarks. Her goal is to encourage quilters to feel comfortable about entering their quilts into competitions because they know they will receive objective, knowledgeable, and (hopefully) helpful feedback regarding their quilts.

Upcoming events:

Upcountry History Museum Exhibit: "We Didn't Wait For Freedom": Civil War Narrative Quilts by Vera Hall through February 18, 2024. The *We Didn't Wait for Freedom* exhibition features 5 quilts from Hall's *We Didn't Wait For Freedom* quilt series, plus a sixth quilt hand and machine pieced by Hall using original Civil War era quilt blocks.

February – It's not too late to sign up for Michelle Giles' Kawandi workshop, Saturday, Feb 10. Registration and Supply list are attached. The cost is \$20.

March – March is our Challenge Quilt month. This year's challenge is titled "*Where I am From*". This could include your town, your state, your ancestry, etc. Quilt dimensions can be no smaller than 20" per side and no larger than 48" per side. If you have any questions, contact Becky Erdman

April – The focus this month is of course on our Guild Show "*Follow the Thread*." This year the show will be held at St. Giles Presbyterian Church on Hudson Rd, April 5 & 6. Registration to enter a quilt (or 2, 3, 4, etc.) is open until March 15. Registration form is attached to the newsletter and can be found on our website.

In Addition, on April 2, Sharon Hufstetler will be joining us to discuss the History of Sewing Machines. In this program you get to learn about the earliest sewing machine and the men

that thought them up. Not only will we learn the interesting details of how our favorite machines came to be, but we'll delve into the drama that came with getting such an invention into circulation. After the presentation there is a hands-on experience where you can not only view sewing machines from the 1840's to the 1960's but you can give hand crank sewing a try.

May – "The Pizza Girls", from The Quilter's Gallery will bring their Show and Tell Trunk Show to the guild. As we go through the quilts, we discuss color, creative fabric use and simple border treatments along with lots of tips and tricks that we have learned in the past 25+ years. Everyone needs new ideas. We hope that our show will inspire you to start a new project or two. We also bring our fabric collections, patterns, rulers, and kits to sell after the "show and tell". It's like having a quilt shop set up at your meeting.

The Wednesday after the meeting they will be running a workshop on Kaleidoscope Quilts.

June – To round out our year, Tammy Silvers will do a Deep Dive into Batiks. Tammy is a batik designer for Island Batiks. In her lecture, Tammy will take us on a closer look at how batiks are made.


- ✤ 1 fat quarter 18 x22" -for the backing

- Scraps of quilting material- do not cut just bring what you have
- 12 weight white WonderFil thread called Spagetti, OR DMC floss or pearle cotton your choice of color or white
- ✤ -#7 embroidery needle -if you have to purchase one, I love Bohin needles.
- ✤ fabric scissors
- thimble-optional, but suggested
