Looking forward to the start of a new year and our wonderful fellowship at our guild meetings. Invite a friend to come.


Remember to share the FPQG business cards with others. There are other quilters out there who would love to join our guild.

Notes from Philanthropy

Hello Quilters!

WOW! WOW!!! You all knocked it out of the park with our request for pillowcases for Lily Pad!

We were quite surprised when Lily Pad told us they now have 26 offices in South Carolina, and would like 260 pillowcases for children coming into the Foster Care program in December. We learned this right around the week of Thanksgiving, and we only had 51 pillowcases made. You all were fantastic in responding to our "cry for help" and the Guild managed to contribute another 105 pillowcases at the December meeting, for a total of 156 pillowcases.

The Guild selected **Lily Pad** as our **Christmas Family** for this year. In addition to the pillowcases, we gave them a check for \$450 to purchase pajamas and other needed items for the children coming into the program in December. Lily Pad also mentioned that they would like to have Squishmallow stuffed pillow toys, and two Guild members purchased 18 of these to include in our donation.

In December we also received 8 quilts, as shown in the three photos shown here:







WNC Disaster Relief Donations:

We were able to donate a total of seven twin size quilts and one large lap quilt for those affected by the disaster in Western North Carolina. Four of the finished quilts donated are shown below:





Philanthropy 2024 Year End Summary:

In 2024, the Foothills Piecemakers Quilt Guild donated a total of 120 quilts, 20 cosmetic bags, 7 tote bags, 197 pillowcases, 5 burp pads, and over 3 pounds of toiletries and toothbrushes to the following agencies:

St. Clares Home: 22 quilts, 6 cosmetic bags, 6 tote bags.

STEPS: 12 quilts, 2 cosmetic bags, 1 tote bags, assorted toiletries and toothbrushes. Piedmont Women's Center: 39 baby quilts, 12 cosmetic bags, and 5 burp pads. Lily Pad: 12 quilts, 197 pillowcases, 18 "Squishmallow" pillows/stuffed toys, \$450 as the 2024 Guild Christmas Family, assorted toiletries and toothbrushes. Victory Junction: 24 children's quilts. Western North Carolina Disaster Relief: 7 twin bed size quilts and 1 large lap quilt. Misc: 3 quilts for community outreach special requests.

Philanthropy Workshop:

Our Philanthropy Workshop will now be held every month at 5:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday of the month, right before our monthly Guild meeting. We meet in a first-floor classroom (go past the kitchen, turn right at the hallway, we are down past the restroom on the left). We sort quilts, match backings for tops, and get items ready to be finished or donated. If you need backing or batting for a Philanthropy quilt, you are welcome to come by and see us, or lend us a hand!

There were 42 members and 3 guests in attendance at the Christmas Social on December 3.





2025 FPQG Challenge Quilt – *Bird's Eye View*

This year's challenge will be to make a quilt from a bird's perspective, or *Bird's Eye View.* This nature-based challenge provides for wide viewpoints and artistic creativity, as well as a bit of thinking outside the box. Challenge quilts will be displayed at the March 2025 FPQG guild meeting. Voting will take place that evening and ribbons will be awarded.

Challenge requirements:

- Quilt must be a new creation, started no earlier than November 5, 2024.
- Quilt must contain the 4 traditional components of top, batting, backing and binding.
- Quilts sides should be at least 12" and no larger than 36".
- Pieced, applique or art quilt are acceptable.
- Quilt must contain a feather. The feather can be real, handmade, stitched or quilted. It should be recognizable as a bird feather. The feather quilting pattern does not count.
- Please add a hanging sleeve large enough for a dowel rod if your quilt size dictates one for it to hang well.
- Submission must contain an artist statement talking about your quilt.






Resource Center
