Nancy opened meeting and welcomed everyone with her Shamrock sunglasses. Please make sure everyone has signed in for our attendance records. February minutes: Sandy Wolf gave a motion to accept the meeting minutes; Suzanne Brehm gave 2nd. No corrections. All approved to accept.

### Committee meeting reports:

Pam Kowalk regarding our quilting retreat: We have 30 quilters registered. \$50 deposit. 1, 2 and 3 person room occupancies are available.

Linda Ligon – gave the **Treasury** report.

Becky Bates shared we have 2 door prizes tonight.

**Dollar door prize** was a spring basket with spring fabric won by Linda Ligon.

Name tag door prize was an "Attic Windows" book won by Gayle Johnson.

Jana Fetch with **Membership** team – 43 present and 2 new members SuEllen Johnson and Ana Conniff. We had 2 guests: Wanda and Elaine.

Jana Fetch has agreed to be quilt chair for our 2026 quilt show. Please complete her questionnaire on what we liked about past shows, what you can assist with, etc. Please provide contact name and info and if you are willing to join in with the planning of our next show.

Linda Harper with **Guild Sales**. Sales are going on tonight. We have fabric, buttons, etc. Also, bring any donations you do not need for future guild sales.

Diane Kent with **Philanthropy** group: We received cosmetic bags, pillowcases and completed quilts tonight. Thank you so much. Members shared quilts that have been completed.

**Veteran Bears** – Diane shared one of Susan Boudreaux' military-themed bears. She is a retired US Navy veteran who lives in our area and is on a mission to encourage as many retired women vets as she can reach. She makes military-themed teddy bears and visits each recipient in person to present the bear and hear stories from their past. You can help Susan's outreach to women vets in our community by collecting your batting scraps for her to use as stuffing. Any size batting scraps will do, even trimmings from finished guilts! You do not need to clean up your scraps or remove any backing. Since Susan doesn't sell her bears or ask for monetary donations, she welcomes any militarythemed or patriotic cotton quilting weight fabric you might like to donate that is at least 1/2 yard which would make 1 bear. Susan has already begun her journey of delivering her bears in SC to women veterans in state nursing care facilities in Anderson and Gaffney, and has more bears ready to deliver to Florence, Columbia, and Walterboro, 45,000 women veterans live in SC alone! Once she completes the state facilities, she will continue honoring women vets in private care facilities. If you have batting scraps

and/or patriotic fabric that you would like to contribute, bring your donation to our next meeting. You can drop your donation off at the Philanthropy Table; Diane will make arrangements to pick up.

# How long will you be collecting batting and patriotic fabrics for the Veteran's Bears?

Our last collection will be at our April 1<sup>st</sup> collecting quilt batting scraps for a lady who is making military-themed handmade bears and she is delivering them to women veterans in nursing homes. She will take any size and fiber-content batting scraps, as well as patriotic themed cotton quilting fabrics. If we need to do another collection in the Fall, we can arrange that.




Are you still collecting bed-sized quilts for the Asheville recovery efforts? Do you need bed-size quilts for Lily Pad? Not at the present time. Our contacts in Asheville have stopped accepting quilts. We are also not taking bed-size quilts for Lily Pad. We are continuing our efforts, however, to make pillowcases for their annual Angel Tree in December. Last year they requested almost 300 pillowcases!

This year, to date, we have made and collected almost 100 pillowcases. This will be an on-going project throughout the year, and we welcome fun, kid-friendly (if possible) pillowcases made from your stash or made from pre-cut kits that we have available for you to pick up each month at the Philanthropy Table.

### Philanthropy Workshop:

Our Philanthropy Workshop meets every month at **5:00 p.m.** on the **first Tuesday** of the month, right before our monthly Guild meeting. We meet in a first-floor classroom (go past the kitchen, turn right at the hallway, we are down past the restroom on the left). We sort quilts, match backings for tops, and get items ready to be finished or donated. If you need backing or batting for a Philanthropy quilt, you are welcome to come by and see us — or lend us a hand!



Art Quilt Collage: A Creative Journey in Fabric, Paint & Stitch by Deborah Boschert



If you've ever wanted to try an art quilt, this is the book for you! I tend to keep with the traditional quilts, but have made an adventure or two out of my comfort zone into the world of art quilts. This book starts with an introduction to needed supplies, fabric selection and inspiration. Once you get started, the sky's the limit! Ms Boschert gives eight design guides for beginning your composition, inspiration suggestions then goes through the steps of shape, construction, surface design & embellishments.
