Nancy Jones opened meeting and welcomed everyone. Please make sure everyone has signed in for our attendance records.


Suzanne Brehm gave the motion to accept the meeting minutes. Gail seconded. No corrections. All approved to accept.

Nancy Jones found some Smokey the Bear fabric and made 2 quilt tops for her uncle and his wife.





2025 FPQG Challenge Quilt - Bird's Eye View

This year's challenge will be to make a guilt from a bird's perspective, or Bird's Eye *View.* This nature-based challenge provides for wide viewpoints and artistic creativity, as well as a bit of thinking outside the box. Challenge quilts will be displayed at the March 2025 FPQG guild meeting. Voting will take place that evening and ribbons will be awarded.

Challenge requirements:

- Quilt must be a new creation, started no earlier than November 5, 2024.
- Quilt must contain the 4 traditional components of top, batting, backing and binding.
- Quilts sides should be at least 12" and no larger than 36".
- Pieced, applique or art quilt are acceptable.






- Quilt must contain a feather. The feather can be real, handmade, stitched or quilted. It should be recognizable as a bird feather. The feather quilting pattern does not count.
- Please add a hanging sleeve large enough for a dowel rod if your quilt size dictates one for it to hang well.



Susan Boudreaux is a retired US Navy veteran who lives in our area and is on a mission to encourage as many retired women vets as she can reach. She makes military-themed teddy bears and visits each recipient in person to present the bear and hear stories from their past.

You can help Susan's outreach to women vets in our community by collecting your batting scraps for her to use as stuffing. Any size batting scraps will do, even those trimmings from finished guilts! You do not need to clean up your scraps or remove any backing.

Since Susan doesn't sell her bears or ask for monetary donations, she also welcomes any military-themed or patriotic cotton quilting weight fabric you might like to donate that is at least 1/2 yard, which would make 1 bear.

Susan has already begun her journey of delivering her bears in South Carolina to women veterans in state nursing care facilities in Anderson and Gaffney, and has more bears ready to deliver to Florence and Columbia, and then Walterboro. There are over 45,000 women veterans in South Carolina alone! Once she completes the state facilities she will continue honoring women vets in private care facilities.

If you have batting scraps and/or patriotic fabric that you would like to contribute, please bring your donation to our February 4th meeting. You can drop your donation off at the Philanthropy Table and Diane will make arrangements to get these donations to Susan.
